Red Bull Flugtag

The high-flying antics of Red Bull Flugtag return to Harriet Island, Sept. 7. Watch from the banks of the Mississippi as teams launch home-made flying machines off a 30-foot high flight deck in hopes of soaring to the wild blue yonder—but, more often than not, plunging into the river below. When you're not taking in the action at Harriet Island, join us for the Flugtag Street Party over on West 7th. This two-block outdoor funfest runs from 2-11 p.m. and features live music (including The Chris Hawkey Band), extreme sports activations from Ride MN, outdoor bars and more.

Saint Paul Classic Bike Tour

Join more than 5,000 riders in exploring the Capital City's gorgeous park system on two wheels at the 25th annual Saint Paul Classic Bike Tour on Sept. 8. Choose from the 15, 32 or 47-mile route and enjoy beverages, treats and live music at rest stops along the way.

Saint Paul Oktoberfest

Kick off Oktoberfest at the Germanic American Institute's Saint Paul Oktoberfest, Sept. 13-14. Hosted at the iconic Schmidt Brewery, the event will include German music, food, vendors, carnival rides, Dachshund races and lots of beer, of course. The event itself is free, but \$5 beer wristbands are required for alcohol purchases.
