There are issues at Ravoux with the computers dropping the Internet connection on occasion. It's possible there are issues with too many people connecting to the network at the same time. Router settings can be looked into.

- OpenDNS settings

Also offending other residents by watching porn.

One argument is that we are providing the connection so we don't have to provide it totally open. Another argument is that we don't have the right to dictate what people do on their own devices. Both are compelling arguments. Posting an acceptable use policy discouraging things like porn and torrenting might help.
