# **Digital Literacy:**

What kind of training we should offer was discussed.

Doing a series of classes was suggested. Giving a lot of advance notice would be good.

Doing instruction on an individual one on one basis might work better at some sites.

Classes might be done at a central location like Mt. Airy or McDonough labs. They would run for two to three weeks. People would need to register for the classes.

Classes would be in October or November. (Before the holidays anyway.)

Doing more advanced classes such as photo editing was brought up. (That was done during the ROSS Grant.)

A lot of the requests for training Beth Pacunas is getting are for things like help using the Internet and help with resumes and job hunting. (Using job search sites, navigating online job applications, setting up an email address.)

Trainings could be specific things like Basic Computer Skills, how to apply for a job, etc.

People might need to be referred to places like the Public Library and Workforce Centers for job hunting and resume assistance.

Having computer help hours on a certain date was suggested. Residents could come down during that period for one-on-one assistance.

Using the built in Windows help system was mentioned. That could be good, but it could confusing for people who need to learn very basic things.
